



INSPIRATION FROM OUR RABBI



To New Beginnings!

I'm so excited about the opportunity to be with you for my first, and quickly approaching, High Holy Days at TBT. For me, and for our friends from Legacy TEEM, it will be a bittersweet season. On the one hand, this will be the first time in 68 years that we will not be celebrating

in East Meadow. On the other hand, how wonderful to be with our new community! May the joy of our togetherness outweigh any sadness so that we can all have a good and sweet 5779!

I wanted to let you know a little bit about how Rabbi Nacht, Cantor Timman, and I planned for these first High Holy Days of our newly merged TBT. We spent a lot of time going through each of the services and looking for ways to ensure that everyone will be comfortable and feel like this is their home. Our choir and our music director have been hard at work alongside the three of us, and I am certain that we will all be awed by the beauty and power of our worship together. These services always take a lot of care and planning from the clergy, but this year, we came with a special focus and a spirit of compromise which we hope will shine through.

When we came to a prayer where we shared a custom or a melody, we kept it, knowing that it will be important to have



pieces we can join in together. Each time we came to a prayer that had differing customs from our legacy congregations, we looked for ways to include both, at different times throughout the High Holy Days. If you don't hear something you're looking forward to at Rosh Hashanah, odds are

that you will hear it at Yom Kippur. We worked to give everyone with experience reading from the Torah and Haftarah in the last couple of years an opportunity to do so



this year. This is why you will see that some of the readings are split between two or more members. We opted for a "the more the merrier" philosophy. We worked hard to find the right places to introduce a few new pieces and prayers, so that we are also all expanding what we know.

We think we have found the right balance, but we won't know until we're done. After the season has ended, we'd love to hear your feedback, particularly what you enjoyed, and what you learned. This year is, after all, our transition year, and so we have the opportunity to try things out and see how they go. We're looking forward to sharing it with you!

During the month of *Elul*, which leads us into Rosh Hashanah, there is a custom to recite the words of Psalm 27

daily. Verse four of that psalm reads as follows:

One thing do I ask of the Eternal, it is this that I seek—
that I may dwell in the house of the Eternal all the days of my life, to behold the Eternal's sweetness

and to gaze on God's palace.



It is my hope that over these High Holy Days, as we usher in 5779 as a new congregation, that we will all feel that we are living out the words of this verse. May we see ourselves dwelling in the House of the Eternal as we come together as our new congregation. When we look around, and gaze upon the faces, familiar and new, of our new family around us, may we see ourselves as gazing on God's palace.

BLOG FROM ISREAL

As the New Year approaches, we are preparing ourselves to start a new chapter of our lives, one that is renewed yearly. With the spiritual "homework assignment" provided by the month of Elul, we have been reflecting on the past year, reviewing our deeds and making mental note of the things we wish to change, retain and renew. There is something exciting about having a clean slate in front of us, much like school children relish their blank new notebooks in anticipation of the school year ahead.

While we focus primarily on personal introspection,



there is also room for collective responsibility. Many of the prayers during the High Holidays are written in first-person plural for the sins of the community. This is a time to reaffirm our active role in the community, and to be willing to take part, as much as possible, in the decision-making process afforded to us. I know that Temple B'nai Torah enters the New Year stronger and more robust as a result of the merger, and I hope that as

a holy kehila, you will apply your new strengths to the wider community of the Jewish world, including issues of Israel-Diaspora affairs.

In my eyes, you, as a vital part of the Jewish People, have a say in issues that affect both the present and the future, and can help make sure that we remain vital and relevant way beyond our own lifetimes. Unfortunately, the politics of the government of Israel, as distinguished from the people of Israel, is dominated by coalition considerations which, since the beginning of Israel's statehood, have relied heavily on the ultra-Orthodox parties. Over the past year, we have seen, in dismay, that government decisions have eroded the path to religious freedoms for Israel and Diaspora Jews of a liberal persuasion. The promise to expand the egalitarian section of the Western Wall was reneged; most recently a Conservative rabbi was detained and question by the police for performing Jewish weddings outside of the Chief Rabbinate. The new Nation-State Bill weakens the 1948 Proclamation of Independence which called for freedom of religion for all its citizens, and takes a dangerous path to render non-Jewish citizens as secondclass citizens.

This holiday season it is of utmost important that we renew our vows to carry out the Commandments, particularly those "between one person and another", bein adam l'havero. I believe that there is a universality to laws and guidelines that teach kindness, respect, and caring for other human beings, and they must guide us in our everyday lives as well as in our civic role as citizens of our countries, and as members of the Jewish People.

I urge that you reaffirm your commitment to a democratic and Jewish Israel. Come visit us and make your presence felt. Support those of us who hold freedom dear, and bolster us in times of despair and weakness when it seems that the future is bleak. You are our partners!



I am so looking forward to officially welcoming our new TEEM






