

INSPIRATION FROM OUR RABBI



Taking a Deep Breath

Every time we gather for prayer, we begin with a moment of meditation and breathing. That moment of quiet, focusing on our bodies' natural rhythms, and centering ourselves, allows us to transition from the hectic pace of the week that was to the restful nature of Shabbat, even if only for a short time. We recognize with gratitude the hard work we have done over the last six days, and like God, we pause to revel in it and recognize its goodness.

This notion of focusing on the breath is about, among other things, intentionality. Breathing is an involuntary bodily function. Most of the time, we do it without thinking about it. But, we can also override the nature of our bodies and slow down, speed up, or deepen our breaths. In this moment as we take control of our breath, we fill our bodies with the breath of intentionality. This allows us to then bring intention to the hard work of prayer.

As we close our first year as a new Temple B'nai Torah, I'd like to ask everyone, as they are reading this, to take in a deep breath, and let it out with gratitude, for the work that we have accomplished over this last year is great, and worthy of pausing to admire.

As we transition out of a year of firsts and temporary solutions, it is right and appropriate to pause and take a deep breath. We take a deep breath in appreciation for the divine path which led us to this moment. We take a deep breath, and recognize the goodness of the work that we have done. We have created a thriving, engaging, multi-generational synagogue. We brought together various and varied traditions and made them work. We learned the work of compromise. We made new friends. We laughed, danced, and mourned together. We comforted each other and prayed for each other's healing and well-being. We celebrated with each other's simchahs. And each step of the way was work. Creation is tough business. Even God needed a rest after creating! The least we can do to honor our work is pause for a moment to recognize it, see it as very good, and commit to continuing the work.

This summer will be a great opportunity for us all to recharge and prepare for the year ahead. It will be wonderful to be past a lot of the transition and be able to focus on the work of enhancing much of what we offer. We're very excited

Before we get to any of it, though, let us all pause, reflect, cut ourselves some slack for whatever may have missed the mark, and recommit to doing the work for the year ahead.

I would like to thank Lisa, of PIP Printing of Oceanside, who has given TBT Times and TBT Voice the professional touch you see in each issue.


One final mention: my personal appreciation to you, the readers, who have made all this effort so very worthwhile.


IN THE HOUSE


