RABBI'S MESSAGE

Rabbi Daniel Bar-Nahum



Welcome back to everyone, as we kick off another great year here at TBT! Though we've been hard at work all summer, and we had many great occasions to come together in prayer, community, and action, there is no question that when September comes, we shift into a higher gear. The year we are soon to conclude on the Jewish Calendar, 5782, is a leap year, meaning we added a month way back before Purim, which is why we have ample time this month to prepare for the High Holy Days, which begin on Sunday, September 25 with Erev Rosh HaShanah. A full High Holy Day calendar can be found on **page 3** of this edition.

As we enter September, we are already a few days into the Hebrew month of Elul, which officially began on Sunday, August 28, and which will continue until Rosh HaShanah. This month is understood to be a month of preparations for the holidays ahead. Each day of this month, we are tasked with readying ourselves for the work of repentance, prayer, and charity which our Days of Awe call us to fulfill. Each day of this month is marked by the sound of the shofar, meant to be an alarm clock, a wake-up call to our souls, to begin the work of *cheshbon hanefesh*, the accounting of our souls.

Elul gives us the opportunity to reflect on who we were in the previous year and commit to being better versions of ourselves in the year ahead. How do we want to be better? What relationships do we need to mend? What behaviors do we want to shed? What actions or thoughts ought we atone for? What actions are we ready to embrace? These questions have different answers for each of us, of course. What brings us together is that we are all asking ourselves the same questions as we hear the same shofar blasts. Each day this month, we're offering a virtual shofar call and a short teaching to give us each a few moments every day to do this work. You can find these videos on our Facebook pages and watch them at your convenience.

Another custom of this month is the daily recitation of Psalm 27. This psalm includes the refrain we hear in our liturgy throughout Elul, *Achat Sha'alti*: "One thing I ask of You, one thing I fervently pray, that I may dwell in the house of Adonai all the days of my life, knowing the beauty and the wonder of you

and to dwell in your holy place." These words from verse four of this psalm get to the crux of Elul. Ultimately, the work we do is in the service of repairing and maintaining our relationship with God. Elul, according to the rabbis, is an acronym which stands for the words from the famous line from Song of Songs, "*ani l'dodi v'dodi li* / I am my beloved's and my beloved is mine." The rabbis see the love described in Song of Songs as between the Jewish people and God. Elul, therefore, is meant to remind us of this relationship and call us to rededicate ourselves to that love and that covenantal relationship. When we rededicate ourselves to God, we understand that God will rededicate to us.

The seventh verse of psalm 27 also speaks to us about the internal work of Elul. We read: "Hear Adonai my voice, be gracious to me, answer me!" This is the shortest verse of the whole psalm and it packs a punch. At the simplest reading, the psalmist is pleading with God that their prayers be heard. This is not unique in our scriptures. As we read it, we know that we take the place of the author, thereby asking God to hear our voices. But in Elul especially, when we focus on the reciprocity between humanity and God, this verse reminds us as well that God will hear our voice, but that it takes work on our part. It requires the work of reflection, preparation, and ultimately *teshuvah*, repentance, for God to fully hear our voices and for us to fully be able to hear God.

"Hear Adonai my voice, be gracious to me, answer me!" also evokes the words of Avinu Malkeinu, which asks God to be gracious to *us* and answer *us*, all of us. Elul's work is the work of each of us. Elul is a time for each individual to repair their relationship with God and with others. When we arrive at Rosh Hashanah, as Elul transitions to Tishrei, and as we move to our communal celebration of our new year, the language shifts to the communal conjugation. Hear us. Answer us.

This year, whether you will be joining us in person or on our livestream, the communal work of the High Holy Days can be made all the more meaningful if we put in the individual work of these weeks leading to them.

Wishing you and your family a Shanah Tovah
u'Metukah! A good and a sweet new year!

May the New Year reinvigorate us to achieve more Temple B'nai Torah successes and bring us the strength to handle the challenges that may lead to those successes.

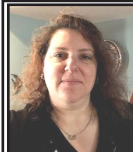
May the New Year bring you an abundance of blessings.

Shofar Service followed by Tashlich

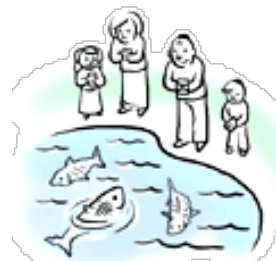

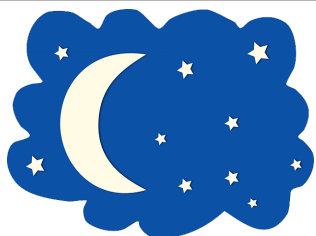
Tashlich is a custom traditionally observed during the New Year. The Tashlich ritual consists of prayers recited near a body of water, accompanied by the tossing of bread into the water as part of the ritual.

The Tashlich service is based on a line from the Prophet Micah,
in which he states:

"You will cast all your sins into the depths of the sea!"

It is believed this custom began during 14th century in Germany.

Prayers for Forgiveness

Selichot - special prayers for forgiveness - are added to the liturgy during the month of Elul as the High Holy Days approach. Selichot prayers call out to God for forgiveness. The Selichot service is traditionally held on the Saturday evening before Rosh Hashanah in order to give people a chance to reflect on the changes of behavior that they wish to make. The service is held late in the evening when, it is said, the heavens are especially open to our prayers, and God will hear our prayers most clearly.

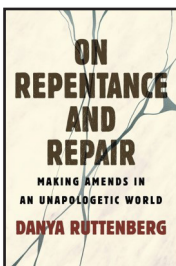

TBT's Social Action/Social Justice Committee hopes you all had a restful and restorative summer! We wish you all a Happy and Healthy New Year!

Throughout the summer, the committee was busy with efforts to provide opportunities to learn about and voice our support for issues of concern, and to help those in need.

We participated in a **March for Our Lives** rally to support common sense solutions to gun violence.

We provided information on how to help the victims of the war in **Ukraine**

- We responded to the call of **Upholding Humanity**, a Refugee Resettlement support program here on Long Island and, in record time, gathered supplies needed to help set up permanent housing for an Afghan Refugee couple and family of three. Thank you to all who participated in this true expression of Welcoming the Stranger.
- Our **School Supplies Collection** once again allowed students in need to start school confident and prepared for their classes and homework assignments.
- We wrote and mailed 500 postcards as part of the **Religious Action Center's Every Voice Every Vote Campaign** and **Common Cause's non-partisan Get Out the Vote** efforts.

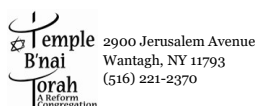
