

RABBI'S MESSAGE

Back to Israel

One of the many exciting opportunities for Reform Rabbis is the annual Convention of the Central Conference of American Rabbis. The CCAR is the professional organization

of Reform Rabbis. Every seven years, the convention is held in Israel. In 2016, I was lucky to attend the conference in Israel. 2023's convention takes place this month, and I am looking forward to a week of learning in Israel and catching up with colleagues. I'm looking forward to a great falafel, buying some new kippot, and gazing upon the blue waters of the Mediterranean Sea and the golden hills of Jerusalem. As much as the sights, smells, and tastes call to me, there are, of course, more pressing reasons why it is important to be present for this convention when it is held in Israel.

One of the reasons that it's important for Reform Rabbis to gather in Israel is that we are still fighting for religious pluralism. It has never been easy to be anything other than Orthodox when it comes to Jewish practice in Only Orthodox Judaism is officially recognized, meaning only Orthodox rabbis, with a few exceptions, are granted authority to perform weddings and funerals for Jews. They also are the only arbiters of Jewish Status in Israel, which is both the same but different than what is required for the Law of Return, which says that any Jew can find a home in Israel. In addition, the only synagogues that get funding from the state, with very few exceptions, are Orthodox. This is a battle that has been waging since the founding of the state, but which has taken on more meaning in the last generation, as the population of religious/ Orthodox Israelis has risen and as more and more Israelis find a home in liberal branches of Judaism.

In addition, if you have been following the news from Israel, you'll know that there is a new Knesset, as a result of the most recent elections in November. (Things in Israel often move quickly and sometimes surprisingly, so there's always a chance that between the time of my writing this column and your reading it, things will have changed.) As I'm writing this, the Government is about to be formed. The party with the most seats of the 120 available is given authority to form a coalition by bringing together enough parties to total at least 61 votes. Benjamin Netanyahu's Likud party took the top slot and he, as its head, has succeeded in forming a new coalition.

The main concern for Reform Jews (and really any non-Orthodox Jew) is the inclusion in this new coalition of extreme right-wing parties and ideas, some of which have never before been welcomed into an Israeli Government. The coalition includes the religious parties, which means, among other things, that the fight for religious pluralism in Israel will be even more daunting for the foreseeable future.

This is why it is so important for a large group of Reform Rabbis to gather in Israel, and why we make a point of going to the Knesset. The Labor Party in Israel includes among its few Members of Knesset, Rabbi Gilad Kariv, the first Reform Rabbi to be a Member of Knesset (MK). Rabbi Kariv is a forceful presence in the Knesset, understandably at odds with those in the Jewish religious parties. We will look forward to hearing from MK Rabbi Kariv while we are in Israel, and hearing from other MKs as to how Israel may move forward when its secular democratic ideals are at odds with its religious fervor. This is not a conflict that is unfamiliar to us in the States.

While only a small fraction of the Reform Rabbinate will be together in Israel, what and who we represent is important. The Israel we aspire to see – one which treats all its citizens, no matter their background, equally; which has room for a variety of expressions of Judaism, not just Orthodox; which is working toward ending the conflict with the Palestinians, and which provides the opportunity for all its citizens to live in peace and comfort – cannot come to fruition without advocacy and challenging the current status quo. The Women of the Wall and The Israel Religious Action Center have been doing this for decades, making slow progress.

Unfortunately, it is the fear that the little progress made stall with newly will. best. the formed government. Nonetheless, we do not abandon Israel. We do not turn our back on it. Like anything we care deeply about, and which is a part of our identity, we fight to make it better and demand that it live up to its ideals. This month, I am looking forward to doing so on the ground in Israel. I'm looking forward to learning and then bringing back to us all the ways in which we can engage with Israel so that together we can all push Israel to be the best version of herself.

I will be away in Israel throughout the Presidents' Week and will look forward to sharing all about what I have learned upon my return.





PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Friends.

Tu BiShvat is the Birthday of the Trees. Celebrated this year at the beginning of February, Tu BiShvat is a day to celebrate the fruits of the season and our connection to the earth.

I have often referred to our temple as the "trunk" of our tree and all of our ARMS as the branches; part of the same tree, rooted together to continue growth. Trees give us oxygen, and so our ARMS give us the "oxygen" we need as we continue to breathe new life into our temple. Trees provide security by offering us shelter. 



Social Action/Social Justice Committee

This month we celebrate Tu BiShvat, The New Year of the Trees! Consider the importance of trees to the well being of our environment. Tu BiShvat has come to be associated, not only with trees, but for plantings, food and with caring for the environment. Although it may not be the best time to plant a tree here in Wantagh, it is a great time to plant trees in Israel through donations to the Jewish National Fund or to help with general reforestation through One Tree Planted (https://netreeplanted.org/) If you are interested in planting something smaller, plant some parsley seeds on Tu BiShvat and they should be ready for your Passover seder! Families can learn about honoring the trees and Tikkun Olam with videos from Shalom Sesame (https://reformjudaism.org/jewish-holidays/tu-bishvat/celebrate-tu-bishvat-shalom-sesame-tikkun-olam). Consider ways to reduce your use of paper; saving paper does not just "save trees," but also prevents burning fossil fuels in transportation and processing. https://hazon.org/commit-to-change/holidays/tu-bshvat/ Bravo to TBT for exploring ways to reduce its paper consumption!

Last month we celebrated **SA/SJ Shabbat**. Many thanks to the Clergy, the Ritual Committee and all who participated in the service for putting together such a meaningful evening. It was a wonderful opportunity to reflect on the work we do all year and to see how connected our efforts are to our Jewish traditions, teachings and ideals. Rona and Bob shared their experiences from their recent trip to Arizona to assist asylum seekers released from ICE detention and during the Oneg, everyone had an opportunity to package welcome kits to support Team TLC's efforts to provide migrants bused to NYC with basic care items and warm winter wear. RELIGIOUS SCHOOL

The first Torah reading this February includes the Song of the Sea, the song Moses and Miriam sang after the waves crashed down upon the Egyptians when the Israelites fled from slavery. It is one of only two sections of the Torah scroll that is written with a different layout from the normal simple columns. Every year when we read it, it always moves me in

different way. Some years I find myself focusing on the text, different then all the others. Some years, I focus on the words, *Ozi v'zimrat ya, God* is my strength and my song. This year, as I practice chanting, I am struck by the contradiction of these two terms. Rarely do we put strength with song. Songs are lilting, beautiful chords, evoking a melody. (Heavy Metal and 80's Hair bands aside, of course) Strength is, well, strong. It hard, its unyielding. And I think that's why Moses sang these words. Life takes both rigidity and flexibility. It takes the ability to see the beauty in the waves crashing, knowing that the same wave can sink ships. Its knowing that the with the harshness of winter comes the beauty of spring. I am comforted by the fact that at end of our time of slavery, there's still a song in our hearts. At the end of our 40 years wandering, we are still able to sing to God. At the end of a long hard day, I am still able to find the melody. I hope you can join us for Ellen Allard Weekend where she will teach us all how to find the music no matter what is happening, no matter what waves are crashing.
