







Celebrations and Happenings this Summer

This summer edition of The Voice highlights the many special events and opportunities going on at TBT this summer, beginning this month of June. If you take a look at the calendar, you'll see that our usual schedule of Beach Shabbats and Shabbat Under the Stars will continue this summer.

See the Ritual Calendar in this edition for all the details about our upcoming, special services. Please also be on the lookout in your emails in case we have to change or update our plans. Cantor will be away on her well-deserved sabbatical beginning at the end of June and through July, and I'll be away in the month of August. Rabbi Poticha and Rabbi Lowenberg will be here on occasion as well.

Please remember that beginning on June 27, with our Boards Intallation Service, we move to 6:30pm for the summers. Our Summer Shabbats in July and August are a little more casual and laid back, as the season warrants. We pray a capella in the Sanctuary. Please also note that the July 4 service will be on ZOOM only. Weekday Torah Study moves to Tuesdays at 1:00pm in July and August.

In addition to the usual summer items on our calendar, I also wanted to highlight that this year, we will be honoring Pride month in a more deliberate way than in the past few years. There is an important reason for this. As rabbi of this congregation, I have always believed that we don't need to make a big show of Pride, because we already do a great job at welcoming everyone, no matter who they are. There has been no antipathy toward Pride, and over the last number of years, our diverse and welcoming community didn't need a reminder to be audaciously hospitable and to love our neighbors as ourselves.

And yet, as we look around our nation today, we see that diversity and inclusion are under attack. Not only in corporate jargon and HR departments, but also in our society. The onslaught of bills attacking members of the trans community and their continual dehumanization and denigration by politicians and pundits shows us that if we believe in inclusion, we have to not only live it, but live it loud and proud. In addition to the various legislation attacking trans people, seemingly settled issues, like same-sex marriage, are once

again being questioned and there are moves to try to overturn the Supreme Court decisions that paved the way for greater equality for our LGBTQ+ neighbors, friends, and family.

This year, our June 6 Family Shabbat service at 7:15 will include some special prayers, readings, and acknowledgments for Pride Month, to remind all of us that the work of inclusion and the work of acceptance is ongoing. Come decked out in rainbows if you like and expect a fun and colorful Shabbat! I'm also excited that our Social Action/Social Justice committee has scheduled an important and what I am sure will be a meaningful session to teach us all more about the trans community and to allow us to ask all our questions without judgment. On Monday, June 9, join at 7:00pm in the Kiddush Lounge as we welcome Juli Grey-Owens, Executive Director at Gender Equality, NY, for "The Language of Gender: A Beginners Guide to Understanding Gender." Please be sure to RSVP to the SA/SJ Committee if you plan to attend. More information is on page 5.

In addition to these important events and celebrating Pride, we've got other exciting opportunities in June. On June 13, during services, we'll have the opportunity to pilot a draft of a new Erev Shabbat Siddur being published by the Reform Movement in 2026. This new prayerbook seeks to update readings, include new song selections, and modernize the translation, even from what was done just over 20 years ago when Mishkan T'filah was first published. This new prayerbook will seek to move from gender-egalitarian language (including both men and women) to what is called genderneutral language. Gender neutral means that it seeks to be inclusive of the spectrum of gender identities. These will be subtle and small changes, but important in terms of our liturgy speaking to all our congregants and all who join us for moments of worship. At that June 13 service we will also hear some updates about recent gun control advocacy, and we're encouraging everyone to wear orange in support of these efforts.

I hope that you have an excellent summer! We will be here working and getting ready for another great year at TBT of learning, praying, and joining together as a community!

NOTES FROM OUR CANTOR

We learn from the first verses of Torah that after six days of creation God creates a seventh day, a day of rest, Shabbat. It is a day in which all work of creation ceases and it is declared holy. This concept of Shabbat and rest continues in the Torah in Levitcus 25:4 "... in the seventh year there shall be a Sabbath of solemn rest, a

Sabbath for *Adonai*; you shall neither sow your field, nor prune your vineyard." The land needs to rest in order to regain the nourishment to provide for the following year's crops. After this fashion, academic and clergy sabbaticals often fall every seven years. It is a time to reinvigorate, study, rest and enjoy family time.

Being a Cantor for the past forty years has meant that vacations are often short, days often roll into nights of work, and uninterrupted weekends and family time are a rare event. What most of us call a 'weekend' is anything but for a member of the Jewish clergy! And although we enjoy a day off each week, it is usually a weekday. Being a member of the clergy also means being on call 24/7. Doctors and lawyers have weekends off and rely on their associates as emergencies arise. Rabbis and cantors develop a different relationship with their congregational family. We are connected often through years of shared moments, life cycle joys and challenges, the education of our children and the central part we play in our 'family of families'. This is the nature of the calling of the rabbinate or cantorate. It is very satisfying work, but in order to be the best we can be, it is important to have the opportunity to occasionally 'hit the refresh button'.

And so I am most grateful to be granted extended time off, a sabbatical by our congregation over these next two summers.

My husband Charles and I look forward to spending this first part of my sabbatical from June 22nd through July 31st in Europe and then hopefully part of next summer in Israel. This summer we look forward to time with our family in London who we last visited in early 2020, just before the pandemic shut down the world. Our travels will then take us throughout Italy where we will visit ancient ruins, cities and countryside, and explore some of Italy's extraordinary Jewish communities and famous ghettos. Reinvigorated and refreshed, I will be back home well before the High Holy Days, ready to take on my duties.

Unlike a regular vacation, while away on this sabbatical I will not be checking my email or messages and they will be deleted before I return. I am indebted to Rabbi Bar-Nahum and our senior staff who will be looking after temple needs. When I return in August Rabbi will then be heading off on the next leg of his sabbatical.

The timing of my sabbatical means that I will unfortunately miss our Temple Board Installation service later this month. *Yasher koach* to Amy Neidle and the outgoing board on their excellent work for our synagogue. Mazal tov to Alisa Baroukh, Stephanie Giwner, and the incoming Board on their installation as our new leadership!

I am excited for this opportunity to recharge and rest, and hope that you also enjoy a rejuvenating and refreshing summer. See you on the other side!



Dayenu's Spiritual Adaptation Workshop at TBT

On April 27, a group of TBTers, Merrick Jewish Center Members, and other individuals interested in the climate crisis, gathered at TBT for Dayenu's Spiritual Adaptation Workshop. We were fortunate to have a wonderful mix of ages participating and sharing their perspectives. A special thank you to Emily Altman for starting us off in song and to our BNTY participants for representing the next generation of climate advocates.

Through song, storytelling and imagination, this highly interactive workshop, led by Rabbi Laura Bellows and co-facilitator Zetti, led participants through feelings of gratitude for the natural world, the values our Jewish traditions have instilled in us, our grief, anger and fears regarding the current climate crisis, hopes for the future and ways to work towards positive change. One particularly powerful exercise was a conversation between elders (those living today) and people from about 170 years into the future. During these conversations we explored what was not working in 2025, what those in the future could learn from our struggles and how imagining a healthier planet could lead to actions we can take today.

Dayenu: The Jewish Call to Climate Action is a national organization advocating for policy and infrastructure changes that can lead to positive outcomes for the environment. There is a local, Nassau Dayenu Circle focused on issues of particular relevance to NYS and Long Island.
